



TIPS&TECHNIQUES

NEVER MIX THESE CLEANING PRODUCTS!

Hydrogen peroxide and vinegar. Combining these creates paracetic acid which is corrosive. It can also harm skin, eyes, thorat, nose, and lungs.

Drain cleaner and more drain cleaner. It's tempting to pour more drain cleaner as you can but these could make for a dangerous situation. Combining different drain cleaners can cause an unexepcted reaction which could release of chlorine gas and potentially lead to an explosion.

Bleach and ammonia. Combining these can release chloramine vapors, which can cause respiratory problems and throat burns if inhaled. A number of cleaning formulas have

bleach or ammonia in their ingredients so take extreme caution before attempting to mix them. It is better to err on the side of caution.

Bleach and rubbing alcohol. Combing these creates chloroform which could knock you out. High levels can lead to nervous system damage, as well as damage to eyes, lungs, skin, liver, kidneys, and even death.

Bleach and vinegar. Combining these can also release chloramine and chlorine vapors.
